- The Organisers reserve the right to cancel, combine or change any class should it be deemed necessary.
- The Organisers reserve the right to limit the entries on a first-come-first-served basis.
- If there are insufficient entries, the Organiser reserves the right to run the show on one day.
- **NO DOGS ALLOWED**
- CRUELTY and BEHAVIOUR OF COMPETITORS: The Organisers reserve the right to fine, warn, suspend and/or eliminate offenders.
- Horses and Riders take part in this competition at their own risk
- The Organisers reserve the right to limit the number of entries accepted to a manageable number, on a first come first served basis.
- Any and all decisions made by the Show Director in terms of collation, organisation and management of the Show will be deemed final and no further correspondence will be entered into.
- AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS: Horses from outside the AHS Surveillance area must have valid AHS vaccinations. All horses must arrive at the showgrounds accompanied by a valid Horse Passport. Current Equine Flu vaccinations (6 months) – compulsory
IMPORTANT - All Western Cape Province Horses/Ponies need to obtain travel permits from State Vet.



The event will be run under SASA and SAEF rules unless otherwise stated.

1. Competitors may only ride one horse in each class, except in the Working Classes, where they may ride up to three horses.
2. All Riders and Horses must be registered with a Club, SAEF and SASA. For Membership see the SASA website www.showingsa.co.za or from admin@showingsa.co.za.
3. SASA will pay entry fees for SASA EDTS competitors in a maximum of 4 Ridden classes per day. The competitor must be an EDTS member of SASA. Membership is free. EDTS application forms, Rules and Conditions are available at www.showingsa.co.za or contact admin@showingsa.co.za for more information. EDTS competitors will earn EDTS Victor Ludorum points.
4. Working Hunters will be required to jump a course of approximately 8-12 fences, one of which will be a combination.
5. Should a competitor qualify more than one horse for the championship, he may nominate another rider, who must be a paid-up member of SASA, to show the horse in that championship. However, the competitor must do the individual test required in the Championship.
6. All classes will be run under SASA Rules Edition 26 effective 1st January 2026
7. EVERY COMPETITOR ENTERING THIS SHOW DOES HEREBY INDEMNIFY ANY JUDGE REGISTERED WITH SASA, OFFICIATING AT THIS SHOW, AGAINST ANY CLAIM OF ANY NATURE FROM ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER.
8. Registered SASA Instructors will earn Victor Ludorum points for pupils.
9. Open Horses may be ridden by the Judge
10. Heights of Horses and Ponies must be stated in the SASA passport.
11. The minimum age of horses shown under saddle shall be 3 years.
12. All competitors, owners and sponsors shall be registered with a club in whose area of jurisdiction they have their principal place of residence, SAEF and SASA and shall be re-registered on 1 January each year. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website www.showingsa.co.za
13. Newcomers are open to riders who have never competed in graded classes in any age group. No cross entry with Graded Classes.
14. Horses shall be registered with SAEF and SASA.
15. The horse and rider combination will compete as a member of the province where the rider is resident.
16. All required vaccines and primaries must reflect in passports and be in accordance with SAEF directives
17. For CN Status Shows on no account and under penalty of disqualification, may a horse take part in any of the showing classes if the horse has been ridden by anyone other than the competitor or judge from the first day of the show until the last day in which the horse competes.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

- **Team Entries** – Notice by Provincial Bodies of their intention to participate in Team Championships must be sent to the show secretary, in writing with a copy to SAEF & SASA (admin@showingsa.co.za), by no later than 12th June 2026. Team nominations, on the prescribed forms, must be completed and received by the show secretary by 19th June 2026 at 16h00. Each province may only enter one team. All team entries must be entered in the individual classes for the discipline concerned. Details/composition of nominated teams is laid down in the SASA Rules.

DURBAN SHONGWENI CLUB

Provincial Committees shall nominate their teams with full details of their team, in writing, to the Organising Committee of the event and to the Discipline Association, not later than SEVEN clear days before the first competition day of the event.

Each Provincial Body may only enter one team in the Inter-Provincial team event and only those nominated, at the briefing on 29th June 2024

- For all other teams, the Team Manager must submit to the Show Secretary their final team selection from those nominated not later than 15:00 or such later time as the discipline Representative shall determine on the day preceding the start of the Team Championship concerned/
- The draw for the Team Championship will be done the day before each Championship at a time to be declared by the OC
- The rules governing the substitutions of team horses and/or riders are laid down in the SASA Showing Rules and General Regulations. Should two or more Provincial Bodies be unable to compete on the National Team Championship in any discipline due to lack of competitors/horses of the required standard, then those Provincial Bodies may combine to send one team.
- This team shall in all respects be deemed to be a team entered by a Provincial Body. All Team Athletes and Horses should be entered in the show and the onus is on the rider and the province concerned to ensure that the team entries are done prior to the closing date of entries or arenas filling up.

Composition:	Show Hack/Show Pony, Show Hunter/Show Hunter Pony., Show Riding Horse/Pony, Working Hunter Pony (80cm), Junior Working Hunter (90cm) and Working Riding Horse/Pony
Prizes:	SASA Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals awarded to the 1 st , 2 nd and 3 rd teams respectively. Rosettes and Mementos to all team members in the event. Junior Interprovincial Team Trophy – “Heir to the Throne” donated by Simone Vermeulen Pony Rider Interprovincial Team Trophy – Free State Horse Society Trophy

CLASS B: CHALLENGE TEAM EVENT

Entry Fee:	Free
Open To:	Horses/Ponies and Riders officially nominated by their Provinces. Each province may only nominate one team as per Rule 61.1.5. No cross entry of horse/pony and rider combinations in the Inter-Provincial and Challenge Team events. Riders may compete in both the Interprovincial and Challenge Teams on two different horse/ponies. Horse/Ponies may not compete in both the Interprovincial and Challenge Team Events with two different riders. Horses will not be ridden by the judge in a Challenge Team Class. Horses/Ponies will not be stripped for <u>conformation in a challenge team event</u>
Composition:	Show Hack/Show Pony, Show Hunter/Show Hunter Pony, Show Riding Horse/Pony, Working Hunter Pony (70cm), Junior Working Hunter (80cm) and Working Riding Horse/Pony
Prizes:	SASA Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals awarded to the 1 st , 2 nd and 3 rd teams respectively. Rosettes and Mementos to all team members in the event.
